A Resolution in Opposition of the
Proposed Nuclear Waste Repository
Near Kincardine, Ontario Nor Any Other
Underground Repository Be Constructed
In the Great Lakes Basin, in Canada,
The United States or Any First Nation Property

Chairman William A. Crouchman,
On Behalf of the Board of Commissioners,
Offers the Following Resolution:

WHEREAS, the Macomb County Board of Commissioners strongly values the water quality of Lake St. Clair and the Great Lakes; and

WHEREAS, the Great Lakes are an irreplaceable resource containing 22% of the world's and 95% of North America's fresh water vital to human and environmental health: and

WHIREAS, the Great Lakes are vital to the economic well-being of the area and the Nation; and

WHEREAS, Lake Iluron and the connecting waters, including Lake St. Clair, are the source of drinking water for millions of people downstream in the United States, Canada and First Nation; and

WIIEREAS, Michigan Act 204 of 1987, the Low-Level Radioactive Waste Authority Act, MCL 333.26201 - 333.26226, set forth siting criteria for the disposal of low-level radioactive waste. Such criteria excludes any site "located within 10 miles of Lake Michigan, Lake Superior, Lake Huron, Lake Erie, St. Mary's River, Detroit River, St. Clair River or Lake St. Clair;" and
